Introduction to Hockey is the first step in the Learn to Play Hockey program. This class is designed to offer a small sample of what ice hockey is like. Kids should have some previous skating experience prior to joining. New skaters should enroll in our Learn to Skate Hockey program if they are not comfortable on hockey skates. New students are allowed to join the level class that will be in November.

Level 1 Equipment Requirements

All players must wear at least a hockey helmet with facemask, elbow pads, hockey gloves, hockey shin guards. Players cannot wear shorts or have any skin showing.

Rental Equipment Option

If you wish to have the full hockey experience, the SLC Sports Complex offers rental gear for FREE for the entire Intro to Hockey Class! **Rental gear comes in two sizes, approximate ages 4-7.** Children older than age 8 will likely need to purchase their own equipment

Rental packages includes: jersey helmet, shoulder pads, elbow pads, gloves, pants, shin guards, skates, and hockey stick.

You will need to provide sweat pants and an undershirt (t-shirt).

You will pick up your Rental Gear the 1st day of class.

Plan to arrive at least 25 minutes early to be dressed by the start of class.

Overview of the Salt Lake City Sports Complex Learn to Play Hockey Program

Ice Hockey is a very challenging sport to learn. Skating, the primary and most important skill required to play hockey takes a great deal of time and practice to master. The Sports Complex has developed the Learn to Play Hockey program to teach the basic skills necessary to play in a recreational hockey league.

The Learn to Play Hockey Program consist of three courses. This cycle is offered twice a year, once in the fall, once in late winter. They are **Introduction to Hockey** (September-October) Level 1 (November-December) Level 2 (January-March) Once your child has completed these three levels, he/she is ready to play in Salt Lake County Youth Hockey. We suggest the fall/winter kids to reenroll in the spring/summer levels.

We highly suggest that students enroll in Learn To Skate Hockey along with Learn To Play Hockey. This increases the number of times the child will touch the ice on a weekly basis and also provide extra instruction. Each child is given a free public skate pass and they are highly encouraged to come skating to a public session once a week.

The further increase the chances of a successful skating experience, we encourage skaters to purchase their own pair of skates. Rental skates, while functional, offer a fit designed to fit everyone, but really slow skating development.

Parental Statement Agreement Assumption of Risk, Liability, Release and Refund Policy

1. Release: I hereby recognize and acknowledge that my child's participation in recreational activities may involve bodily and/or emotional injury to myself and/or my child being permitted to participate in such events, I, myself, my child, my heirs, my executors and administrators, hereby voluntarily release, waive, discharge Salt Lake County its officers and employees from and all liability except that caused solely by the negligence of Salt Lake County, that may result from my child's participation in Salt Lake County Parks and Recreation activities.
2. Refund Policy: As per Salt Lake County Policy and Procedures, the Parks and Recreation Division may withhold 25% of the program (program registration fee) for administrative costs. All refunds must be requested person and be accompanied with a written refund request. No refund shall be given the first day of program.
3. Collections: I agree to pay Salt Lake County all costs incurred, together with reasonable attorney's fees in event that my account is referred to the Salt Lake County attorney's office for collection.
4. Emergency treatment: I hereby authorize Salt Lake County Parks and Recreation program staff to act in my behalf on accordance with their best judgment in case of an emergency involving my child, and agree to assume full responsibility for all expenses, medical, or otherwise, that may arise there from. I understand that I or my insurance will be billed for such emergency treatment.
