Beth Graham welcomed everyone and began with overall highlights:

II. Remarks from Mayor McAdams:

- Mayor highlighted that there are many people in this audience and working on this project that are Kearns Residents. He highlighted Kori and said it is exciting to see progress and plans come together.
- There are plans for business and development, the community center plans- location
- Mayor mentioned he saw Annie E. Casey in Washington and they are excited about the work the Kearns Initiative/ Evidence to Success is doing in Utah
- Parents Empowered Grant- a \$10k grant, state funded that we were able to get to work
- There are a lot of other grants available and that is what we are here to do, is help apply and bring those to life for the people here in Kearns

III. Subcommittee Presentations

A. Expanded Opportunities/Evidence2Success- *Erin Trenbeath-Murray and Caroline Moreno*

- Some Highlights: workgroups have been very active, lots of data collection, lots of evidence –based programming, huge focus on SHARP data (survey taken through the schools) which was used to come up with priorities
- Looked at community to see what kind of programs and organizations are already working in the community
- The group has solicited and engaged a lot of involvement from the youth community which is very exciting
- In February- will have an evidence based funding program or plan (the subcommittee) is thinking about how they have funded and what they will do moving forward.
- The Expanded Opportunities subcommittee is always looking for folks to be a part of the community engagement groups- ongoing. Come join us! Contact Caroline Moreno for more information at cmoreno@slco.org

- Laurie Stringham of Healthy People asked for clarification on Evidence to Success factors they are looking at (to ensure the two subcommittees are not duplicating)

B. Healthy People- *Laurie Stringham and Colin Hilton*

- Laurie started off by reminding everyone that they are the only subcommittee within the initiative that does not have any grant assistance. The committee is working with SLCO health, Intermountain Health and also looking into State grants that may be available and fit the needs for Kearns Residents
- This subcommittee has separated into 4 different work groups on the 4 specific outcomes: 1)Preventative Health Work Group 2) Nutrition Work Group 3) Physical Activity Work Group 4) Financial Stability Work Group
- The Healthy People subcommittee is recruiting people for these workgroups. If you are interested please contact **Laurie Stringham or Colin Hilton**
- Preventative Healthcare workgroup
 1. Asthma- Asthma Home Visitation Program run through SLCO Health Department
 2. Breast Cancer/Mammography Screening- Mammography screening event in February 2017 Sponsored by Intermountain Health
 3. Healthcare Access- Health Access Project through Ellis R. Shipp Clinic
 4. Mental Health/ Depression- Case management and looking to expand services

*Nate of Intermountain Health talked about Behavioral Health looking at option to partner with Kearns and also working with Kearns clinic to get some help with the Asthma visitation program.

- Nutrition workgroup- Focusing on choices of healthy food options for Kearns residents. Assisted in applying for an EPA grant to conduct a community assessment. The workgroup is still looking to recruit additional workgroup members
- Physical Activity Workgroup- Looking at a few different kinds of Grants to help with the Healthy People subcommittee. Utah Recreation and Parks Associate Partnership
- Financial Stability Workgroup- Kori is bringing Junior Achievements and partnerships from Chamber West, USU extension, Kearns Seniors, DWS and others....

- Starting in February or March- Junior Achievement, a high impact program (a pilot program that came from Junior Achievement). The goal is to bring up the average of people who can get their taxes done for free. The need is here. We are linking existing services to Kearns residents. There is also opportunity to serve on this Healthy People Subcommittee.

C. Healthy Places- Steve Perry and Alison Weyher

- Some items they are working on: County Library is 50 years old, Unified Policy Substation too small to properly function, Excess community demand for local provider services, community action program want to construct facility for education, workforce services, childcare and other programs, county wants to expand and upgrade recreation campus, 5400 S. retail needs a facelift, Camp Kearns is ready for new roads.
- Kearns Community Campus Funding
 - Salt Lake County Library \$2,000,000 approved (\$1,000,000 proposed)
 - TRCC \$250,000 approved
 - Salt Lake County 2017 Budget \$5,600,000 proposed
 - Total Available for land purchase \$8,850,000 Grand Total
- Next Year- paving the roads in camp Kearns, this spring working with partners to provide more resources for residents to live and stay in Kearns (Habitat for Humanity, Community Action Program and CWC Utah to name a few)
- Communication to Kearns residents is the focus- says Steve Perry
- County is talking with UDOT to install a bridge over 5400 South.

- Beth Graham announced the next topic- Governance Structure of Municipal Services District Kearns Metro Township Council
- Rick Graham will talk about what the change means for Metro townships. Rick will explain the MSD funding and structure
- The goal is that we provide an innovative blue print that is embraced by the community not a huge change (we hope).
- The 4 Metro townships and Millcreek City will meet together through MSD funding group \$31 Million (ish) to purchase and allocate all county services.
- Kearns will come to SLCO to say this is what we want you to do.
- For more information about the Municipal Services Funding Structure (slide 30 in the presentation outlines it well). You may also contact Rick Graham with any questions regarding the MSD specifically.
- Karen Crompton talked about the transition with the Future We Choose Project and Salt Lake County. The question is, how do we transfer or give this project to put it in the hands closer to the community benefiting from it. The Kearns Metro Township will have the ability to make decisions itself.

- SLCO is creating a transition plan over the next months to provide a good road map to Kearns Metro Council
