3. Needed to reduce the number and scope of actions towards each vision/desired outcome.
4. Large workgroup needed individual subcommittee focus

Where we are

Refined Committee Outcomes/Goals to the areas of:

1. Kearns residents engage in preventative and comprehensive health care
2. Kearns residents are food secure and consume healthful diets
3. Kearns Residents have the ability, confidence, and desire to be physically active for life
4. Kearns families are financially stable

Next Steps

- Subcommittee members now populating strategies and actions for each vision/desired outcome
- Committee to prioritize actions, set realistic timelines and performance measures
- Broadening the subcommittee networks
- To gather feedback on the concept Work Plan to ensure efforts will meet community interests

- Orient Key Leaders January

- Begin fund mapping March-July
- Convene first Community Board Meeting April
- Workgroups begin meeting April

 - Resource Assessment
 - Youth Involvement
 - PR & Outreach
 - Funding & Finance
- Finalize Vision Statement May
- Select and approve priority outcomes and risk and protective factors May-July
- Draft a strategic PR & Outreach plan June
- Outreach to the Community and Key Leaders Ongoing

COMMUNITY ASSESSMENT REPORT

August 2016

Where we are

- Conduct Resource Assessment Workshop (Aug-Oct)
 - Inventory evidence-based programs currently being offered in Kearns in a 3-session workshop
- Engage the Community and Key Leaders (Ongoing)
 - Through events, emails, presentations, and one-on-one interactions, the E2S Board is committed to soliciting community feedback and engaging more residents in workgroup activities.

Next Steps

Select evidence-based programs October

- Select the evidence-based programs that best address our priority risk and protective factors

Implementation Phase December 2016+

- Conduct a series of at least eight workshops that guides the selection of programs to implement; trains service providers; establishes processes for implementation to fidelity; and lays the groundwork for program evaluation. This phase includes an RFP process with the Community Foundation of Utah.

Healthy Places

Where we were

- September 2015
 - Planning study for updates to Oquirrh Park Master Plan just beginning
 - Discussions underway about a new Library – should it be combined with other services
 - Habitat for Humanity received a favorable recommendation from the Kearns Planning Commission for Field of Dreams
 - Finding safe ways across 5400 South was identified as number one goal of the committee

Where we are

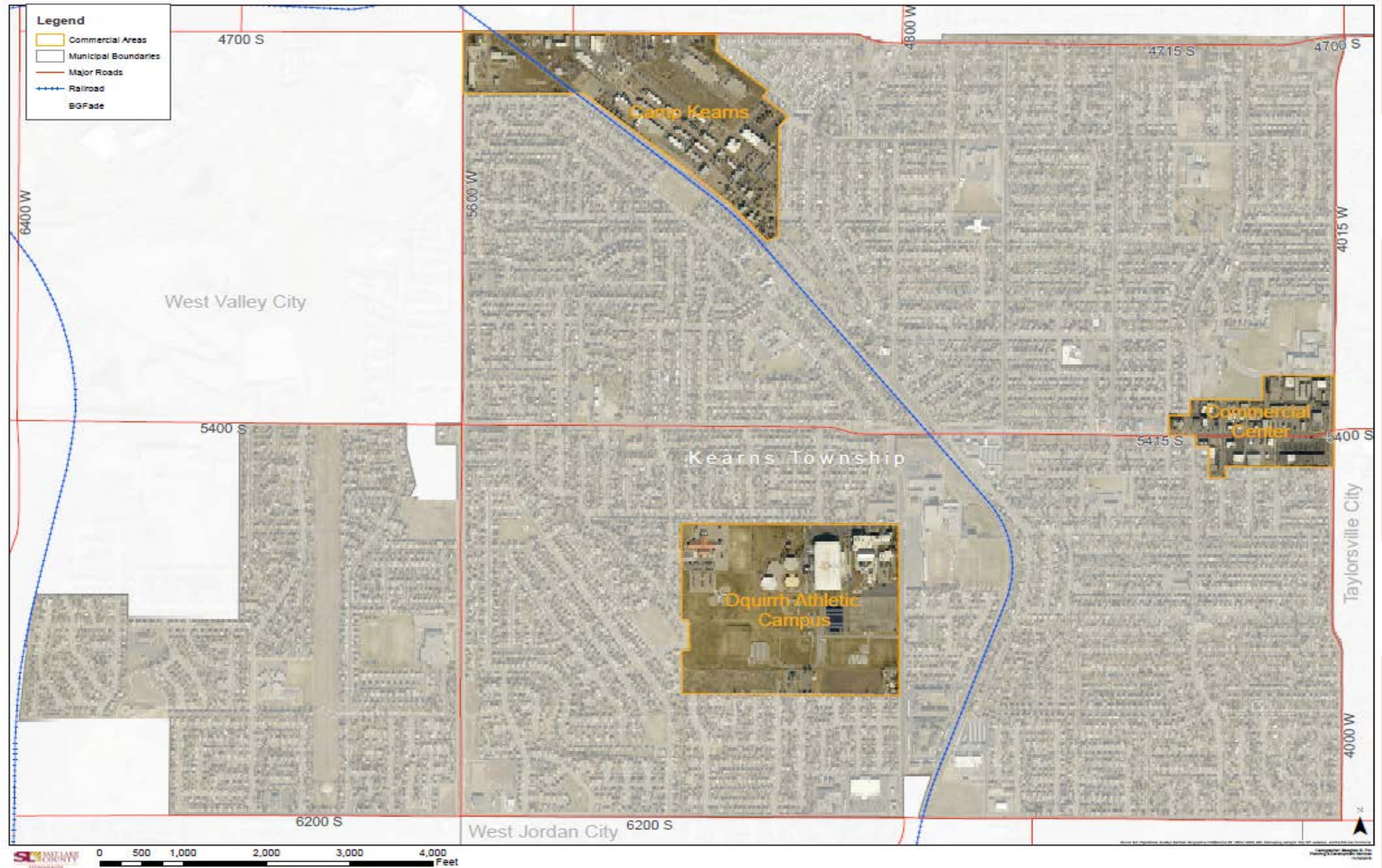
- Oquirrh Park Master Plan ready for presentation to the Town Council, Planning Commission, etc. for approval
- Master Planning study for community campus underway
- Field of Dreams groundbreaking this week
- UDOT has agreed to remove through lane on 5400 South

- Continue to promote affordable housing renovation programs
- Continue to work with UDOT to make improvements to State roads in our community
