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### **Salt Lake County Announces Public Comment Period for the 2016-2017 Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report**

Salt Lake County has prepared its annual performance report to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development on the uses and results of its funding for the fiscal year July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.

The Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER) will be available for public review and comment for 15 days, **September 3 - September 18**, on the Salt Lake County website: <http://slco.org/housing-community-development/>

Salt Lake County receives grants through a number of HUD programs:

- Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
- HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME)
- Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)

This report reviews the progress that has been made in carrying out the 2<sup>nd</sup> Year of the 2015-2020 Consolidated Plan and 2016 Action Plan.

The report contains:

1. Summary of projected accomplishments compared to actual performance
2. The status of actions taken during the year to fully implement the overall strategy defined in Salt Lake County's Five Year Consolidated Plan, the 2015 Action Plan; and
3. A self-evaluation of progress made during the last year in addressing identified priority needs and objectives.
