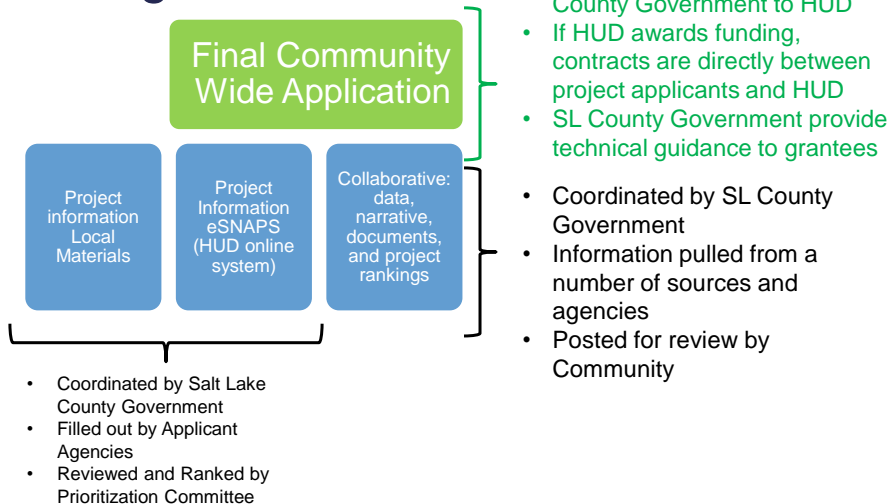

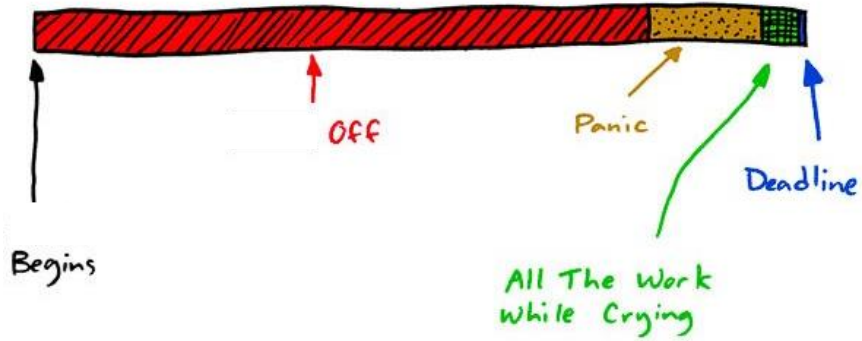
Background

- There are over 400 CoC's nationwide, including three in Utah:
 - Balance of State
 - Mountainlands; Utah, Wasatch and Summit Counties
 - Salt Lake and Tooele Counties' CoC (UT-500)
- This training is about the HUD Continuum of Care (CoC) Grant; which is related to but distinct from the HUD Continuum of Care System Planning Process.
- The HUD Continuum of Care Grant is comprised of multiple parts that are submitted as one combined application. Total funding is approximately \$6.5 million.

New Project local and eSNAPS applications due to SL County	26 days after NOFA Release
SL County will post project rankings	45 days after NOFA release
SL County will post draft of Collaborative Application	50 days after NOFA release
Comments about Collaborative Application due	55 days after NOFA release
Continuum's full application submitted to HUD	58 days after NOFA release
HUD deadline for submission of Continuum's full application	? 60 days after NOFA release

Renewal Application Prep Work:

Renewal Applicant agencies:

- Attended trainings
- Submitted local application materials
- Updated their eSNAPS profiles

SL County Government has:

- Trained and provided materials
- Provided technical guidance
- Facilitated preparation in advance of the NOFA

Renewal Application Remaining Steps

Renewal Applicant agencies:

- Read the NOFA and attend trainings
- Will fill out the eSNAPS application once the NOFA is released
- Fill out one page form to check for consistency
- Make updates in eSNAPS, if requested

SL County Government will:

- Provide feedback on eSNAPS profiles
- Release one page form
- Train and provide materials on the NOFA
- Provide feedback on eSNAPS applications

Collaborative Portion Prep Work

- Received process guidance from Tara McFadden
- Regrouped the Prioritization committee and began the review process
- Prep work for narrative portions
- Reviewed FY2013 application
- Providing support for development of Governance Charter
- Begun pulling APR data

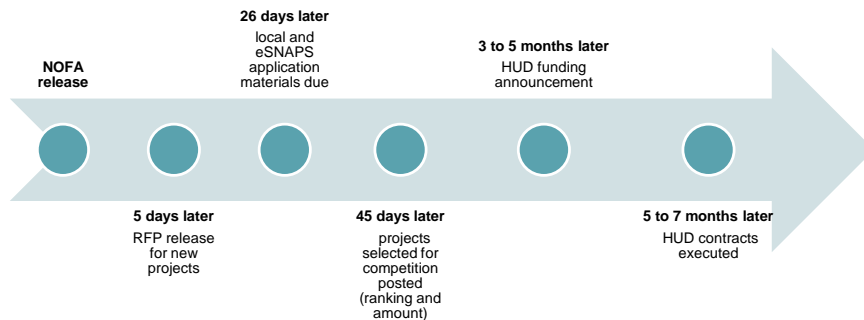
Collaborative Portion Remaining Steps:

- Work with HMIS and HMIS Steering Committee (HMIS and PIT sections)
- Work with Tri-CoC group (Discharge Planning and Mainstream Benefits sections)
- Begin gathering info for narrative sections; intend to draft sections and then release for feedback
- Review and disseminate NOFA information
- Continue providing staff support to the Prioritization Committee

Full membership:

- Approval of Governance Charter
- Approval of Operating Policies and Procedures
- Approval of HMIS SOP
- Comment and Review of Collaborative Sections

Reallocation

- Rapid Rehousing for Homeless; Families or Singles
- PSH for Chronically Homeless; Families or Singles
- Coordinated Access
- Expansion of HMIS Lead project

Bonus Project

- No known information, but anticipate it will be PSH for Chronic

Applicants are encouraged to meet with SL County in advance of the NOFA.

CoC Funding Strategies/Expenditure

Expenditure:

- Reminder about HUD requirement to draw down quarterly.
- Unexpended funds are returned to the HUD national pool.

Funding Strategies:

- After ranking applications, Prioritization Committee selects funding strategies
- In the past they have chosen from: “No cuts” strategy, Project type, Expenditure, and Performance
- Committee and chose one funding strategy or a combination of strategies
