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Salt Lake County Planning Commission To Make Traveling Tour

Salt Lake City, UT—The Salt Lake County planning commission will make a traveling tour to property at the mouth of Big Cottonwood Canyon this week. The property owner—Cottonwood Estates Development—has filed an application to rezone the 47 acres located on the northern side of the canyon entrance.

County planning division staff will accompany members of the commission. The traveling tour will give them the opportunity to tour the property prior to holding a public hearing the following week to discuss the rezoning request. The applicant is requesting a change from the current FR.5 zone, which specifies half-acre lots, to FM 10 Forestry Multi-Family.

“Traveling tours are authorized under state statute. A traveling tour can better acquaint planning commissioners with the property under consideration,” said Salt Lake County Planning Director Rolen Yoshinaga. “Because this is not a public hearing but rather an open meeting, no public discussion is held.”

Yoshinaga said commissioners will travel by van from the Salt Lake County government offices to the private property, leaving the building at 8:30 a.m. on Friday, June 7th.
