Pedestrian Fatality On 3300 South Highlights Traffic Signal Need

Salt Lake County, UT—Salt Lake County Mayor Ben McAdams and Township Executive Patrick Leary said they are deeply saddened by the pedestrian death this week, at 2940 East 3300 South. A woman was struck and killed in the crosswalk as she attempted to cross the busy street at dusk.

"We all mourn when a tragedy such as this occurs in one of our county neighborhoods. Making streets safe for pedestrians and drivers alike is a responsibility that we take very seriously in the county," said McAdams.

Leary said that 3300 South is a state road and is under the Utah Department of Transportation's planning and engineering jurisdiction. Leary said plans are already underway to install a traffic signal at that location in the near future.

"I will work closely with my counterparts at the state to ensure that this project moves forward as rapidly as possible. This week's terrible accident reinforces the need for better traffic controls on this extremely busy artery," said Leary.
