SLCo's 2021 Water Conservation Goals



Mayor Wilson set a goal to reduce SLCo's facilities water footprint by 5%

- April-October 2021

We challenged residents to accept challenge of reducing their use by 5%

Launched SLCoH2O.org website and #WaterWednesday campaign

- "Do a Little. Save a lot."

Did SLCo meet our 5% goal for 2021?

YES!

Salt Lake County agencies stepped up to the challenge and reduced our water use consumption by

33.3 million gallons

OR 50 OLYMPIC POOLS!

In 2021, Salt Lake County operations REDUCED WATER USE BY 13%

SLCo Water Conservation is the New Normal

Mayor has agencies continuing with the 5 Rules

1. Wait to water until May 15 or later
2. Continue to water one less day a week from normal watering practices, for the entire 2022 season
3. Monitor and adjust sprinklers weekly to ensure they're watering lawn & plants
4. Use a broom to maintain sidewalks and parking lots

Ask SLCo residents to take the challenge again

- If 25% of residents conserved 5% of their typical water use, SLCo could collectively save 2 million gallons of water every single day

If we all collectively do our part to make small changes, we can help conserve the water needed now and for future generations. Do a little. Save a lot.
