



Summer 3 on 3 League 2022

DATES: June 7-July 14: 6 weeks of games.

AGES: 6 – 12 years old.

COST: \$95 per player.

FORMAT: One night/week, 1.25 hour of ice, 3 games per ice session.

LOCATION: All games played at the County Ice Center.

Registration Information: (Individual registration begins Monday, May 10th at noon)

- Team registration happens first (see attached team registration flyer). Individual registrations is available for any remaining spots after team registration closes. It's possible that some divisions may have no additional room after team registration is complete.
- The cost per player is \$95. SPACE IS LIMITED!!!
- Register on-line at countyice.activityreg.com or in person at the County Ice Center.
- Enter as a team: fee is \$95 per skater, max of 9 skaters per team. If your team does not have 9 skaters, individual registrations may be added to your team until it reaches the maximum of 9 skaters. (see team info page for more information)
- Goalies register independently of teams.
- Games nights will be Tuesdays, (Squirt 5:30-6:45 pm), (Peewee A 7:00-8:15 pm) and Thursdays (Mite 5:30-6:45 pm), (Peewee B 7:00-8:15 pm) at the County Ice Center.
- After registration deadline (Tuesday, May 24th), SL County personnel will assemble teams as needed and the coaches will be notified regarding the rosters.

Registration Deadline: Thursday May 24th

Play begins Tuesday, June 7th (SQ & PW A); Thursday, June 9th (MT & PW B)

Summer 3 on 3 Hockey

General Information

1. League Philosophy

- SL County Youth 3 on 3 Hockey is intended to improve player's skills such as passing, shooting, and team play in a fun, recreational but competitive and educational setting.
- Every effort is made to ensure fair play and sportsmanship among players and coaches.
- Equal opportunity is stressed for every player.

2. Game Format

- Each time slot is 1 hour 15 minutes.
- Each time slot has 3, twenty minute games, i.e. each team plays 3 games.
- Each time slot will begin with a 5 minute warm-up.
- Each game will have 2-ten minute halves, running-time with a 1 minute break between periods.
- After the conclusion of the first game, there is a 1 minute break, the teams then rotate to their next scheduled game.
- Each game will have one referee.
- The referee is responsible for calling penalties, and overall game management.

3. The Rink

- The ice surface is divided into 3 sections. Games are played in each end from the blue line to the end boards and cross-ice.
- The neutral zone acts as a player's bench as well as the coaches and officials area.
- Across each blue line will be a barrier to help keep pucks in play.
- Nets will be placed approximately 4 feet from the side dasher boards.

4. Rules

- No checking for all divisions.
- Penalties result in a penalty shot from "center ice" for the offended team.
- The five players not taking the penalty shot may back check the shooter starting from the far boards on the referee's whistle. Once the penalty shot has been taken, a face off takes place if a goal is scored. If not, the puck is live and play continues.
- Face-offs are only held after goals are scored.
- Change on the fly is a from designated "change zone" only. This area, approximately from the neutral zone face off dots to the boards, acts as the player's bench.
- If a puck leaves the playing area, the referee determines which team caused the stoppage. The puck is then given to the other team in the area the puck was lost. The team not given the puck must back up a reasonable distance before they can be challenge the puck carrier.
- If a shot on goal results in the goalie "covering" the puck, then the puck is given to the defensive team and play is resumed. The team not given the puck must back up to at least half ice pass before they can challenge the puck carrier.
- No overtime and no time outs.
- Standings will not be kept or posted.
- Game scores will not be kept.

5. Teams

- Each team will consist of a minimum of 4 skaters and a maximum of 9 skaters (see the section #7 for goalie information). Teams may be entered as a combined unit, and/or teams will be created by program management from individual registrations. See the last page for full details on entering teams.
- SL County Administration can add independent players to any team until the maximum number of skaters (9) is reached. Maximum of 36 skaters and 4 goalies per age division.
- Each team will have a volunteer coach or coaches. Coaches are to be on skates and remain in the neutral zone during the games. **Coaches MUST wear helmets while on the ice!**
- Teams will have matching jerseys except for goaltenders which will have the same color jersey.
- Teams will be rotated in order to play each of the other teams each week.
- Teams can be composed of travel team players, recreational players or a combination of both.

6. PLAYER REGISTRATION

- If your player will be moving up a division for the 2022-23 season due to age, you have the choice of registering your child in the age division they played in during the 21-22 season OR registering them in the age division in which they will be playing in the 2022-23 season.

7. Goalies

- Goalies register as individuals and not as part of a team.
- Goalies do not rotate with teams. They will play for and against multiple teams each week.

8. Age Divisions (2022-23 season)

- Mites 6 – 8 years old, born in 2014, 15, 16 Squirts 9 – 10 years old, born in 2012, 13
- Pee Wee 11 – 12 years old, born in 2010, 11

9. Referees and Scorekeepers

- Officials and scorekeepers will be contracted through private organizations that provide these services.

10. Volunteers

11. Equipment

- Full ice hockey equipment is required for players. This includes HECC approved hockey helmet with face mask, mouth guard (pee-wee and bantam), shoulder pads, elbow pads, hockey gloves, hockey pants, shin guards, cup and supporter or pelvic protector, ice hockey stick, and hockey skates. On-ice coaches are also required to wear HECC approved helmets and also to wear skates.

12. Pre-requisites

- *Participation in the 3 on 3 program is restricted to players with previous ice hockey experience. Players with no ice hockey experience should register for a learn to play hockey program. ****Players must have completed at least one season in an organized hockey league such as the Salt Lake County Youth Hockey League or an equivalent level of play to play in the Summer 3 on 3 program.***

Team Registration Information

- Team registration opens Tuesday, May 3rd at 9:00 am and closes Monday, May 9th at 12:00pm
- Teams need to have one head coach and up to two assistant coaches.
- Teams must have a minimum of 4 players and a maximum of 9.
- If a team has less than 9 players, spaces may be filled with individual registrations.
- Team names will be assigned by County Ice Center from the list of team names used during the 2021-22 Salt Lake County youth league season. This is done so all players are covered by ISI insurance.
- In order to register a team coaches will contact Alan Canfield at acanfield@slco.org with the division, coach or coaches name(s) and team roster after 9:00am on May 3rd and before noon on May 9th. Emails received outside of this window will not count. This is the fairest way to give everyone an equal chance.
- All individuals on the roster submitted by the coach will be registered without payment before individual registration begins. Once individual registration begins, Tuesday May 10th, these players will be able to pay their individual fee at the County Ice Center or online. Any rostered players that have not paid by May 24th may lose their spot.

Parental/ Participant Statement of Agreement Assumption of Risk, Liability Release, Indemnification and Refund Policy

1. Release & Indemnification: I hereby, recognize and acknowledge my child's participation in recreational activities may involve bodily injury and/or emotional injury to myself and/or my child. In consideration of my child being able to participate in such events, I, for myself, my child, my heirs, my executors and administrators, hereby voluntarily and knowingly indemnify and hold harmless, defend, release, waive, and discharge Salt Lake County, and its officers, employees and volunteers from any and all suits, claims or liability, including negligence, based on any injury except that caused solely by the willful misconduct of Salt Lake County, that may result from my child's participation in Salt Lake County Parks & Recreation activities. In addition, I agree that I or my insurance company will pay for medical, hospitalization or any other expenses resulting from my child's participation.
2. Refund Policy: As per Salt Lake County policy and procedures, the Parks and Recreation Division may withhold 25% of the refund (program registration fee) for administrative costs. All refunds must be requested in person and accompanied with a written refund request. No refunds shall be given after the first day of the program.
3. Collections: I agree to pay Salt Lake County all costs incurred, together with reasonable attorney's fees in the event that my account is referred to the Salt Lake County Attorney's Office for collection. I understand that any account delinquent 30 days or more will be turned over to the Salt Lake County Attorney for collection.
4. Emergency Treatment: I hereby authorize Salt Lake County Parks & Recreation program staff to act on my behalf in accordance with their best judgment in case of an emergency involving my child, and agree to assume full responsibility for all expenses, medical or otherwise, that may arise there from. I understand that I or my insurance company will pay for such emergency treatment.
5. Equal Opportunity: Salt Lake County Parks & Recreation provides equal opportunity to participate regardless of race, creed, or gender, and will, upon request, provide reasonable accommodations to individuals with disabilities.
