CONSTITUTION

Article I. Name

The name of this organization shall be the "LADIES OLD MILL GOLF ASSOCIATION".

Article II. Aim and Purpose

The aim and purpose of this organization is to sponsor and foster women's amateur golf activities at the Old Mill Golf Course, Salt Lake County, UT, in accordance with United States Golf Association procedures and rules and the Conduct of Utah State Women's Golf Association unless necessarily modified by the local rules.

Article III. Constitution

A copy of this constitution and by-laws will be available to all members. Members are urged to read the same and will be held responsible for any violations.

Article IV. Membership

Section 1. Membership shall be available to all women 18 years of age and older who have paid the annual club dues for the current year.

Section 2. All league members must have an 18-hole USGA Handicap card for the Old Mill or an 18-hole multiple listing. All Handicaps will be computed by the UGA.

Section 3. Only members in good standing shall be eligible to play in the weekly association tournaments and vote at meetings and at the annual election of officers.

Section 4. The Executive Board shall determine membership dues annually as they deem adequate to operate and maintain the Association. All monies collected shall accrue to the benefit of the membership.

Section 5. There will be no refund of dues unless cancelled before the first day of play or as the Board approves. Members joining the league any time after the spring meeting will not be entitled to a reduction of dues.

Article V. Officers

The officers of this association shall be:

All officers shall be elected by vote of club members. If an officer resigns during the year, the Executive Board shall fill the position by appointment.

Article VI. The Executive Board

The President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, State Representative, Team Captain, Head Tournament Chair, Handicap Chair and Immediate Past President shall constitute the Executive Board. The President may call a meeting of the Executive Board at any time and the majority of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum at any meeting.

CONSTITUTION - Continued

Article VII. Election of Officers

Election of officers shall be conducted yearly at the fall meeting if members have volunteered for Board positions it shall be the duty of this committee to secure the consent of and present the names of one or more nominees for each office. The ballot shall be posted one month prior to the election.

Nominations may be accepted from the floor, provided consent has been given by the nominee.

Paper ballots shall be provided by the Executive Board, signed by the voting member, counted by the Secretary and certified by the Treasurer. Elected officers assume duties immediately.

Article VIII. Amendments

The Constitution and By-Laws may be amended in respect by submitting each amendment in writing to the club secretary thirty days prior to the final meeting. The amendment will then be brought before the club members to be voted upon. A two-thirds majority of all voting members present shall be necessary to make an amendment.

Article IX. Standing Rules

Standing rules (Constitution and By-Laws) shall be subject to review and revision by the incoming Executive Board. They shall notify the members of any proposed changes at the spring meeting. The members shall vote on any proposed rule changes. Rule changes require majority approval by all members in good standing present at the spring meeting.

Any proposed changes AFTER the spring luncheon must be posted for membership review for at least 30 days. Ballots will be provided and a voting deadline set by the Executive Board. Only members in good standing will be eligible to vote. Votes will be counted by the Secretary and Treasurer. Mid-season changes require a majority of all votes cast.

Section 1. Membership Dues

Membership dues shall be collected yearly and will be used exclusively to fund the association. No dues will be accepted after the maximum limit of 160 members. In the event of maximum membership, a waiting list will be established.

Section 2. Rules

All members should become familiar with the USGA Rules of Golf, the local course rules and golf etiquette. They shall conduct themselves accordingly at all times. USGA rule books can be purchased at the pro shop.

Section 3. Handicaps

All league members must hold either an 18-hole UGA Handicap card at Old Mill by June 1.

All members must have established a handicap with the UGA by the 1st Tuesday in June to be eligible for membership and to compete for prizes. New members joining after the beginning of April will have one month to establish a handicap. Established handicaps require a minimum of five (5) 18-hole scores.

All players must record league play scores on the Tuesday posting sheet. Recorded scores should reflect the new Equitable Strokes Control rules established by the UGA for 1998 (refer to chart on page 7 of this handbook).

CONSTITUTION-Continued

Section 4. Scorecards

Each player is responsible for the scoring and accuracy of her own card. The card must be signed, attested, including handicap, be dated and turned in immediately after play..

Only scorecards signed, dated, adjusted per Equitable Stroke Control and attested will be recognized. If a golfer "picks up" and "X's" out the hole, she will use the Equitable score to post for handicap. There is no limit as to the number of incomplete holes for posting a score. All scores with 13 or more holes must be posted.

Section 5. Inclement Weather Rule

In case of inclement weather, only the Golf Pro and Tournament Chair will make the final determination. On a league golf day if the weather turns bad after play is started, each individual can choose to continue playing or leave. If they complete their round, it will be added to the ringer board. If a minority stay and complete their rounds, closest to the hole and play of the day will be cancelled. If a majority of the league that started play complete their round, closest to the hole and play of the day will remain in force. Those that have left will be counted as having played a league day, in order to qualify for Club Championship.

Section 6. Hole-in-One

In order to participate in the Hole-in-One Club, you must have paid your annual dues AND hole-in-one fee. All monies will be placed in the fund and will be held until the end of the season when all hole-in-one winners will share the hole-in-one fund equally. Maximum pay is \$200 per person per year. (Maximum allowed for amateur payoff). If no hole-in-one occurs or any monies remain, a maximum of \$300 will be carried over for the next year. Any amount exceeding \$300 will be returned to the general fund.

Section 7. Slow Play

Players are expected to keep their position in the field. Players a hole behind the group in front of them must invite players in back of them to go through.

Section 8. Putts

At the beginning of the year each member will pay \$5 to be included in the dues for the putt fund. Only putts that are stroked on the green should be counted. Player must play 50% of the league days in order to qualify for the lowest putts contest.

Section 9. Birdie Board

The birdie board will be updated regularly. Birdies based on gross scores will be posted for all flights.

Section 10. Ringer Scores

Ringer Chair shall set the Ringer Rules and collect the ringer fees. Ringer scores will be calculated on Tuesday play based on a completed 18-hole round.

Section 11. Team Play

Team play shall be governed by the UGA with the exception of any local rules for eligibility. All team players must be members in good standing of the UGA and LOMGA and have played in one Tuesday event at least 30 days prior to team play. The team captain will choose the roster for each match according to the most recent handicap index, starting with the lowest handicap member available to play and proceeding upwards until all positions are filled. The team captain may bypass the

next eligible team player at her discretion with that player's approval. In case of ties in eligibility for team play, the previous Tuesday's score will be used to break the tie.

Section 12. Club Championship

To be eligible for the Club Championship, a member must have played at least 50% of the Ladies' league scheduled Tuesday play and must be a member in good standing. Participation in a team match **may not** be substituted for a Tuesday league day. The Club Championship will be three consecutive league days, with the winner determined by the best score of two of the three days. In case of a tie, the winner will be decided by a scorecard playoff.

For individual prizes like CTP, Longest Drive etc, a member who is eligible to play in the championship can win these prizes regardless of how many weeks played in championship, ie. if only played once.

Section 13. Winter Rules

Under Appendix 1 (*of the USGA "Rules of Golf"*): Adverse conditions are sometimes so general throughout a course, it's believed "preferred lies" or "winter rules" would promote fair play or help protect the course. A ball lying on a "fairway, rough or fringe" (greens not included), may be lifted, cleaned without penalty and placed within one club length of where

it originally lay, not nearer to the hole, so as to preserve as nearly as possible the stance required to play from the original lie. This Local Rule does not apply to greens, any hazards, bunkers or unplayable lie situations. Determination will be made by the tournament chair, or her designee, as to whether "winter rules" apply that day or not. It will be announced before heading to your starting hole.

Section 14. No Shows and Not Signing Up

A league member who doesn't call the message number (801-733-5996) to cancel their reservation will incur a \$30 penalty. This is a fine initiated by the Clubhouse. If a person has shown up to play that has not signed up, they can choose to pay a \$10 fee or forego playing that day. This is a fine initiated by the league.

FEE MUST BE PAID BEFORE ANY FURTHER LEAGUE PLAY WILL BE ALLOWED. This precludes any further team play, as well.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Duties of the Officers

President:

The President shall preside at all general and executive board meetings and shall have the general supervision of the affairs of the organization and shall appoint committee chairs as deemed necessary.

The president-elect must have held an executive board position in the previous year. In the event there is not an executive board member nominated for President, a member in good standing may then be nominated.

Vice President:

The Vice-President shall function in the absence of the President and shall assist the President with all club activities. The President shall acquaint herself with all procedures of running the club and will act as membership chair and enforce the membership cap.

BY-LAWS - Continued

Immediate Past President:

The immediate past President shall attend all the Executive Board meetings, with power to vote and assist the new President whenever needed.

Secretary:

The Secretary shall be responsible to the President and Executive Board to keep a complete set of records of all meetings of the association and conduct all correspondence as so instructed by the President. She shall compile a yearly roster and handbook.

Treasurer:

The Treasurer shall collect and keep all funds of the association and disburse them as directed by the association. She shall keep a full account of monies which shall at all times be open to inspection by the executive board to whom monthly reports shall be made in writing. She shall report the financial condition of the association at each meeting. She shall provide a list of all eligible members to the Tournament Chair at the first of each month.

The signature of the Treasurer or the President shall be required on all checks.

Handicap Chairperson:

She shall be responsible for all aspects of handicapping according to the USGA handicap system. She shall record and review scores and handicaps. She will handle all handicap grievances.

Head Tournament Chair and Committee:

Shall be responsible for planning and conducting all competitions and purchasing awards or trophies for the association. They shall prepare a schedule of events for the season and distribute it in printed form to all members and declare all daily play winners.

Team Captain:

The Team Captain shall be responsible to the President and Executive Board for organization of the club's team as per USGA rules, informing the members of the team matches as scheduled by the state organization and for determining line-ups. The Team Captain is required to attend the State Team Captain meeting in the spring and to receive the packet containing the information necessary for running the team events.

Historian:

It shall be the duty of the Historian to create the scrapbooks belonging to the club and shall handle any publicity.

Rules Committee:

A three-person committee shall be established at the fall meeting for the following season. Members shall first volunteer for the committee. If three members do not volunteer, the outgoing executive board shall appoint the number necessary to fill the three slots. This committee shall serve to settle any disputes within the league. They will oversee the constitution and by-laws and any amendments or changes to such and the procedures to be followed.

Standing Committees:

The President, with the approval of the Board, shall appoint such Standing Committees as are necessary to conduct the affairs of the Association (i.e. Match Play Captain and assistant, Cancer Society Tournament Chair, Hospitality Hostess, Social Chair and committee, Fundraisers, Phone Committee, Birdie Board and Ringer Board).

Adjusting your score with Equitable Stroke Control

Equitable Stroke Control sets a maximum number that a player can post on any hole depending on the player's Course Handicap.

For Handicap purposes, you are required to adjust your hole scores (actual or probable) when they are higher than your (*the*) maximum you can post.

There is no limit to the number of holes on which you can adjust your score.

18-Hole Maximum Number by Course Handicap Posted on Any Hole

9 or less.....	Double Bogey
10-19	7
20-29	8
30-39	9
40 and above	10

****QUICK HINT:** Whatever your handicap, add 6 to the first digit and this is the adjusted score you can post on ANY given hole. (Example: Your handicap is 31. Add 6 to the 3 and the most you can take on any hole is 9.)

Incomplete Holes:

If you pick up on a hole, record the score you most likely would have made. That score, however, must not exceed your Equitable Stroke Control limit.

For the purpose of remaining in the "Play of the Day", you may pick up your ball at any time.. Your score for "Play of the Day" will be your Equitable Stroke Control limit plus 2. You will count 4 putts as part of that score.

For the purpose of posting your score for handicap, you will adjust to your Equitable Stroke Control limit.

Recommendation to pick-up your ball when you are your Equitable + 2 AND not on the green yet.

Holes Not Played:

When a hole is not played, your score for the hole is par, plus any handicap strokes to which you are entitled, based on your full Course Handicap. This also applies to any hole that you do not play by the Rules of Golf.

DO NOT post these scores:

- (1) If you played fewer than 13 holes.
- (2) When you play in a competition limiting the types of clubs used, as in a 3-club or irons-only tournament
- (3) When an 18-hole course is less than 3,000 yds.
- (4) When a majority of the holes aren't played under the Rules of Golf, as in a "scramble".

If you have any questions about Equitable Stroke Control or anything else concerning your handicap, please call the Handicap Chairperson.

Ringer Tournament

You may participate in the Ringer Tournament if you have paid your \$5.00 dues. The ringer board will be effective from May 1 through September 30.

There will be five flights with five places paid in each flight for low gross over the five-month period.

The total amount of the fees paid for the Ringer Board will be divided for the prize money. The initial gross score will be taken from the first weekly tournament scorecard posted after May 1st.

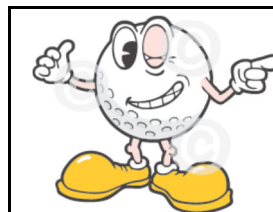
Each time a Tuesday gross score is posted, any individual hole score that is lower than the initial one will be posted on the Ringer sheet.

The total of the lowest gross score for each hole will determine the winners.

Easy Ways to Speed up Play

We Play "ready golf"

Jump out of the cart and tee off while scorekeeper catches up.

Ditch your headcovers. Taking them on and off all day is a serious time suck.

Only mark a short putt to clean it.

First to putt out grabs the flagstick and waits to put it back. Always

Glean as much knowledge as you can about your next shot while approaching it.

Waiting? Take as many practice swings/strokes as you want. Your turn? You get one.

Always be moving forward. If you have to double back for anything—bag, cart, clubs—you're losing time.

Hit your ball first, then help others search. They'll typically find the ball without your help.

Always have a spare ball handy.

Two players in the same bunker? The last one to hit rakes. The first one to escape marks and reads the putt during the raking.

When sharing a cart, use a buddy system

Don't wait in the cart while your cartmate hits and then drive to your ball. Get out and walk to your ball with a few clubs. Be ready to play when it is your turn and then let your cartmate pick you up. Or, drive to your ball after you drop your cartmate off and then pick him or her up after you hit.

Be helpful to others in your group

Follow the flight of all tee shots, not just your own. Once in the fairway, help others look for their ball if you already know the location of yours. Volunteer to fill in a divot or rake a bunker for another player if needed.

Be ready to attend the flagstick for others.

Pick your line of play once and trust yourself. Try to take no more than one practice swing, then set up to the ball and play your shot. Most importantly, be ready to hit when it is your turn. Be efficient after your shot too. Start moving toward your next shot promptly. Aim to play in 20 seconds From club selection to pre-shot routine to execution, strive to hit your shot in 20 seconds when it is your turn to play. Help keep play moving at a brisk pace.

Collect scores on NEXT hole

GOLF ETIQUETTE

Arrive at the course, ready to play, at least 30 minutes early.

Get to the tee box 5 mins. before scheduled tee time, in order to give yourself time to prepare (stretching, practice swings, etc.)

Be ready to hit when it is your turn. Do your visiting while you are walking or in the clubhouse.

Do not move or talk when another player is ready to hit or putt.

Count all strokes, including whiffs and penalties.

Keep up with the group in front of you. If for any reason you are holding up the group behind, wave them through.

All members of the group should help look for a lost ball (5 mins.). Wave the group behind through.

Limit practice swings to two.

Do not debate or hold up play on a rule dispute. Play two balls and check with the Pro when the round is complete.

Replace all divots made with your club and repair all ball marks made by your ball on the green.

Work together as cart partners. Observe location of each player's drive. It helps to have the cart driver tee off first. Be ready to move out after last individual has teed off.

Return head cover while going to the next shot.

Cell phones should not be used, EXCEPT in case of an emergency. Cell phones MUST be in the vibrate mode or turned off. If you must make or take a call, do so away from play, but DO NOT hold up play.

In the fairway:

If you know you are going to use the same club you just used for your next shot, do not return it to your golf bag.

Whenever possible, try to make club selection before arriving at your ball.

Driver is responsible to get herself or her cart partner to the closest ball. While this ball is being hit, the other individual may (should) get out and walk to her ball and get ready to hit whenever doing so would not cause interference.

It is not necessary to run from shot to cart, etc., just pick up the pace of your walk to the cart and return your club to the golf bag.

Always park carts or lay your clubs behind the green on the shortest route to the next tee. Do not leave your clubs in front of the green – necessitating you retrieving them after you putt and causing the group behind you to wait.

GOLF ETIQUETTE - Continued

On the green:

The player closest to the pin should tend the pin while the golfer furthest from the pin putts first.

Always mark your ball on the putting surface. Ball marker should be placed behind the ball, then pick up the ball.

Hole out your short putts if they do not interfere with the putting line of other players.

Hole out all putts. There are no “gimmees” or “dead balls”.

Person closest to the pin tends the flag. The first person in the hole returns the flag after the last person holes out her putt.

Leave the green after holing out. Mark your score on the next hole. Someone should tee-off immediately. (Drivers should be ready to tee-off first.)

Rake and smooth out all footprints when leaving the sand traps.

After all players in your group are on the green on par 3 holes, wave the group behind you to hit on.

Please be considerate of the groups behind you.

Thank you for your support and for making this club such a great success.

RULES OF PLAY

USGA rules will govern play except when local rules are in effect Local Rules: Use drop areas on holes 2, 3, and 10.

Play all lost balls/unplayable lies as a lateral hazard (see appendix A for example). Fourteen club limit

All scorecards MUST be signed, dated and attested before presenting to tournament chairperson(s).

Avoid slow play. Please keep pace with the foursome in front of you.

It is recommended that all League Members participate in Club activities when possible, including being an officer or assisting officers.

Social Reservations Etiquette

Flyers will be posted giving details concerning the scheduled socials (cost, time and deadlines).

RECEIPT of monies by the Treasurer IS your reservation

Don't be a “NO SHOW”. No matter what the date, call the Social Chair if you need to cancel. There may be a waiting list – DO NOT arrange a substitute yourself.

“Late Cancels” will not receive refunds.

20 Must Know Rules of Golf Changes for 2019

1. Drop from knee height. (NOT shoulder height)
2. Measure the area to drop in with the longest club in your bag. (except a putter)
3. Drop in and play from the relief area.
4. When dropping back-on-the-line, your ball cannot be played from nearer the hole than your chosen reference point.
5. Time to search – 3 minutes (NOT 5 minutes)
6. If you accidentally move your ball when searching for it, replace it without penalty.
7. No penalty for a double hit – it only counts as one stroke.
8. No penalty if your ball hits you or your equipment accidentally after a stroke.
9. No penalty if your ball strikes the flagstick when you have chosen to leave it in the hole.
10. Spike mark and other shoe damage on the putting green can be repaired.
11. Ball accidentally moved on putting green – no penalty and replace.
12. Ball marked, lifted and replaced on putting green is moved by wind to another position –replace ball on the original spot.
13. Penalty areas replace water hazards, and you can move loose impediments, ground your club and take practice swings in penalty areas without penalty, just as you can on the fairway or in the rough.
14. You can't take relief from a penalty area unless you are at least 95% certain your ball is in the penalty area.
15. In bunkers you can move loose impediments.
16. In bunkers you cannot touch the sand with your club in the area right in front of or right behind your ball, during your backswing or in taking practice swings.
17. Free relief is allowed if your ball is embedded on the fairway or in the rough. (but "embedded" means that part of your ball is below the level of the ground)
18. Unplayable ball in bunker – extra option to drop outside the bunker for 2 penalty strokes.
19. You cannot have your caddie or your partner standing behind you once you begin taking your stance.
20. Pace of Play - it is recommended that you take no longer than 40 seconds to make a stroke (and usually you should be able to play more quickly than that) and Ready Golf in stroke play is encouraged.
