History Note

The position of Salt Lake County Treasurer was created in 1852, (Utah Code Annotated, 1876, title 4, chapter 4, p. 130). The mission of the Salt Lake County Treasurer is to efficiently administer the property tax billing, collection and property tax relief programs for Salt Lake County, and professionally and prudently manage all monies belonging to the County and others as directed by law. The primary responsibility of the Salt Lake County Treasurer is to collect county fees and taxes. The treasurer falls under the administration of the county commissioners (known as the county court prior to statehood).

Scope and Content Note

This series consists of two books: the Assessment Book of the Net Proceeds of Mines for Salt Lake County, 1897 and 1896. The book for 1897 has information for the following mines: Montezuma Mine (West Mountain), Giant Chief (West Mountain), The Conglomerato Mine (West Mountain), and the City Rocks Mine (Little Cottonwood). The book for 1896 has information for these mines: Benton, Montezuma, York Mine, Story, 1889, Crown Point, Vindication, Blanche, Placer, Morett, Giant Chief, Dalton and Lark, and Societe des Mines (all West Mountain). Both books contain the following information for the above listed mines: name of mine, name of owner, mining district, number of mine owners, residence or place of business of mine owner, number of tons extracted during year ending June 1st, gross value per ton, total gross value, actual cost of extracting ore from mine per ton, actual cost of transportation of ore to place of reduction per ton, total actual cost of transportation of ore to place of reduction, actual cost of reduction or sale per ton, cost of construction and repair of mines and reduction works, total net proceeds or value assessment, assessed taxes (state tax levies, county tax levies, district and special school tax), and total amount of taxes (box #s 203-10-4-11 and 203-19-4-12).
