

Salt Lake County Court – Utah Territory 1850-1896

The first formal meeting of Salt Lake County Government under territorial jurisdiction occurred on March 15, 1852—eighteen months after the Utah Territory was established by the U.S. Congress. Until statehood in 1896, the county courts held both judicial power for probate matters and executive power for administration and management of county government.
