



## Early Voting Notice Salt Lake County 2018 Primary Elections

The 2018 Primary Elections are being conducted mainly by mail for which eligible registered voters in Salt Lake County were mailed a ballot. In conjunction with vote by mail, early voting locations will also be available for the 2018 Primary Elections. Voters who chooses to vote early must show valid identification. The upcoming 2018 Primary Elections are a process by which political parties nominate candidates to represent their party in the November General Election. The Republican Party requires voters to affiliate with their party to participate in their primary. The Democratic Party does not require voters to affiliate with their party to participate in their primary. There are no primaries this year for other political parties. The rules for conducting partisan primary elections are established by the political parties – not the County Clerk’s Office. **NOTE: In the November General Election, voters may vote for candidates of any political party regardless of their party affiliation.**
