



## PROCLAMATION

**WHEREAS**, the State of Utah was founded by Mormon pioneers seeking refuge from persecution; and

**WHEREAS**, disqualifying individuals from opportunity and protection based on nationality or religion is contrary to the very principles of those early pioneers; and

**WHEREAS**, Salt Lake County welcomes people of all faiths, beliefs and practices, regardless of national origin or ethnicity, who seek refuge from persecution and desire opportunities for a better life; and

**WHEREAS**, many of Salt Lake County's residents are immigrants and refugees who arrived here through extreme hardship and now strengthen and make positive contributions to our community; and

**WHEREAS**, individuals and families that retreat to our country to escape extreme poverty or violence in search of opportunity and a better life deserve to be treated with kindness and dignity; and

**WHEREAS**, the Utah Compact, signed with bipartisan support in 2010, champions values that continue to ring true today, including a respect for the rule of law and a belief that "local law enforcement resources should focus on criminal activities, not civil violations of federal code;" and

**WHEREAS**, Salt Lake County works cooperatively with local law enforcement and all communities to uphold the law and create welcoming environments where differences are respected and residents can find safety, common ground and shared prosperity, thus creating positive experiences for all; and


**WHEREAS**, Salt Lake County supports families as "the foundation of successful communities" and endorses the declaration of the Utah Compact that "we will oppose policies that unnecessarily separate families" and will "champion policies that support families and improve the health, education and well-being of all Utah children;" and

**WHEREAS**, Salt Lake County recognizes that many in our community are currently fearful of actions that threaten the unity of their families and deny refuge for those who are being persecuted and oppressed abroad; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, I**, Ben McAdams, Mayor of Salt Lake County, Utah proclaim on this day, January 27, 2017 that Salt Lake County will continue to recognize the plight of immigrants and international refugees, model the principles of inclusion and welcome people fleeing oppression and life-threatening conditions, along with their children, as our moral, compassionate response to humanitarian crises.
