Are the draft indicators clear?

- Communication Power:
 - If you had to stand in a public square and explain the outcome to your neighbors, what two or three pieces of data would you use?
- Proxy Power:
 - Does it say something of central importance about the outcome?
- Data Power:
 - Do we have quality data?
 - Is the data reliable, consistent and frequent enough to know if things are changing?
