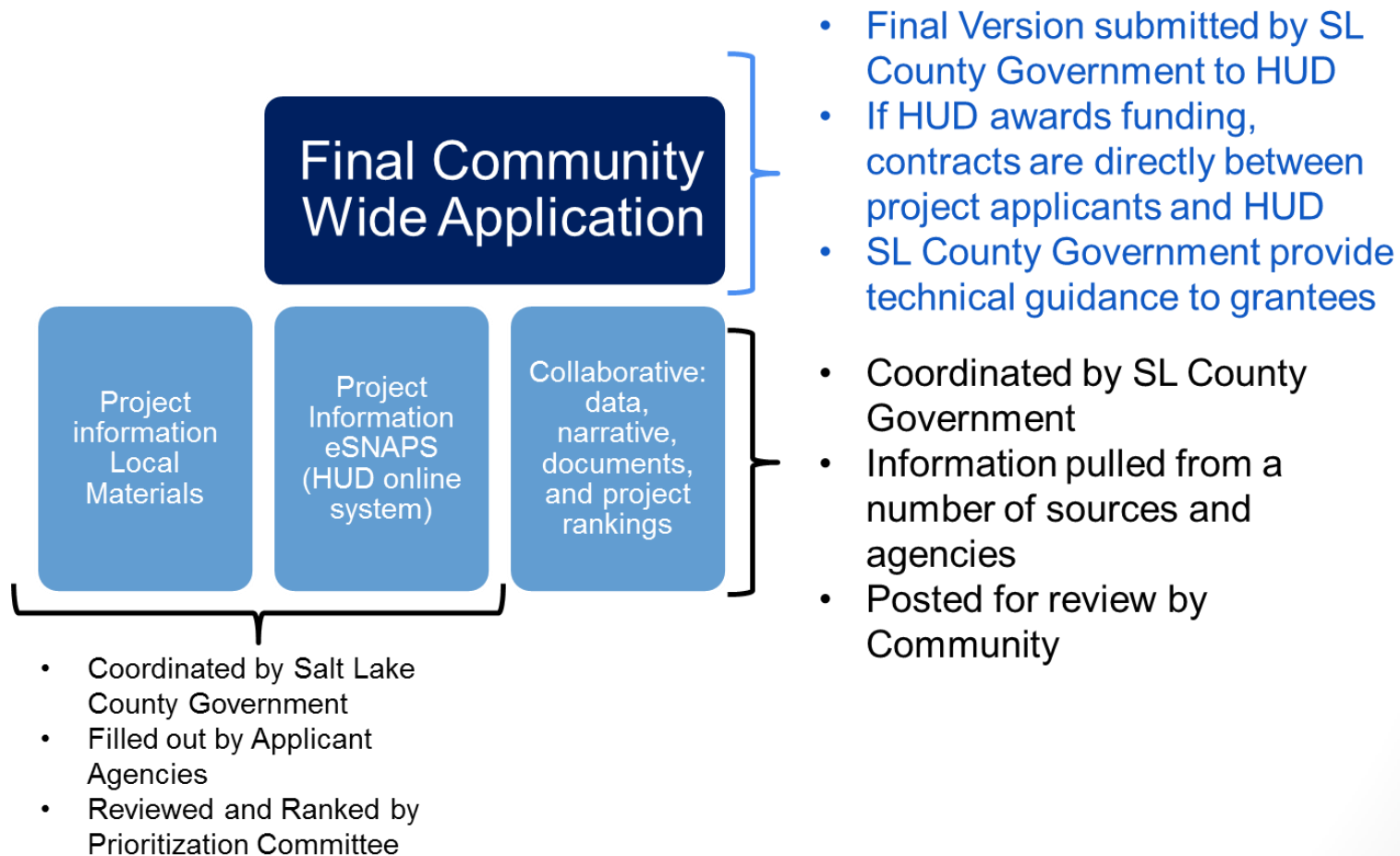

- eSNAPS profiles have been drafted (but will need to be updated)
- Reallocation materials have been shared
- Prep work has been done for the Collaborative portion

## 2) Background – NOFA focus

The NOFA focuses on the Administration Goals from Opening Doors: Federal Strategic Plan to End Homelessness. These are mirrored in the **FY2015 HUD CoC Policy Priorities** first released with the CoC Registration Notice in April 2015:

1. Strategic Resource Allocation
2. Ending Chronic Homelessness
3. Ending Family Homelessness
4. Ending Youth Homelessness
5. Ending Veteran Homelessness
6. Using a Housing First Approach (PH and TH)

## 2) Background – NOFA focus

Programs are being measured in FY2015 By the objective to end chronic homelessness and to move the homelessness into permanent housing. **HUD has chosen six indicators which will be collected in the FY2015 application:**

- 1) Creation of new PSH beds for CH
- 2) Decrease in the number of CH
- 3) Increase the employment of persons residing in or exiting programs
- 4) Increase the use of mainstream resources for persons residing in or exiting programs
- 5) Percentage of non-CH dedicated beds prioritized for CH
- 6) Percentage of households served in RRH that came from unsheltered locations

## 2) Background – Collaborative

Collaborative Application (200 points possible):

- 1) CoC Coordination and Engagement – 49 points
  - 2) Project Ranking, Review and Capacity – 26 points
  - 3) HMIS – 18 points
  - 4) PIT Count – 9 points
  - 5) System Performance – 38 points
  - 6) Performance and Strategic Planning – 60 points
  - 7) Bonus Points – 3 points
- More quantitative data, numeric fill-ins, drop down menus, checkbox selections.
  - Fewer narratives and open-ended questions

- Fixable - Firefox
- Fixable – Internet Explorer Version 10 and 11
- OK - Internet Explorer Version 9 and earlier

# 4) Project Types

**Additional questions added in eSNAPS to capture info about applicant capacity for renewals and new projects:**

1) Project Eligibility

2) Timely submission of:

- APRs
- eLOCCS draws
- Unresolved HUD and OIG findings
- Performance

**Must meet HUD NOFA project eligibility and project quality threshold requirements.**

# 4) Project Types - Renewals

## **Next Steps:**

- 1) Update the eSNAPS profile documents – push the submit button
- 2) HUD will publish detailed instructions – follow them closely
- 3) Fill out the eSNAPS applications – don't submit; save as a PDF
- 4) Fill out cover form – threshold requirement from NOFA as well as note any changes from local application
- 5) Don't forget to attach the match letters!

**Amount of \$ Available:** \$94,866 up to.... [depends on quality of renewals]

**Length of Grant Terms:** 1, 2, 3, 4, or 5 for tenant based rental assistance. 1, 2, or 3 for leasing. Up to 15 year for project based or sponsor based rental assistance.

**How many projects can be funded:** Discretion of the Prioritization Committee

**How is it funded:** Reduce or Eliminate existing project and create new

# 4) Project Types – PH Bonus

PSH for Chronically Homeless Individuals or Families

RRH for Singles or Families (including DV and Youth)

**Amount of \$ Available:** Max. \$977,172; multi-year or single year

**Length of Grant Terms:** 1,2, 3, 4, or 5 for tenant based rental assistance. 1, 2, or 3 for leasing. Up to 15 year for project based or sponsor based rental assistance.

**How many projects can be funded:** May apply for one or more.

**How is it funded:** Not as completely separate \$ pot (competes for ranking) but funds are in addition to renewals/reallocated

# 5) Funding Levels

**Tier 1 Funding Level = \$5,537,312**

**Tier 2 Funding Level = \$977,172 + \$977,172**

**Combined total = \$7,491,656\***

- HUD indicates it believes it as enough funding for the amount equal to renewals/reallocated
- Selection process for Tier 1 and Tier 2 are different

Renewals, Reallocated, and Bonus:

- will be ranked and tiered
- will be selected for funding using the same formula by HUD (based on tier placement)

# 5) Funding Levels

Tier 1 Funding Level = \$5,537,312

**HUD will fund Tier 1 first:**

- Tier 1 selected in order of CoC score
- Enough funding for all Tier 1 projects



# 5) Funding Levels

**Tier 2 Funding Level = \$1,954,344**

## **Tier 2 Award Process:**

Tier 2 projects will receive a point value:

- 60 points for CoC application score (collaborative score)
- 20 points for CoC's ranking (project)
- 10 points for the type of project
- 10 points for Housing First commitment

Tier 2 projects will be selected by point value and in the order of the CoC score.
