Notice: Process for CoC Planning Project in the FY2016 HUD CoC Competition

I. OVERVIEW

Salt Lake County Government is the Collaborative Applicant for the Salt Lake City and County Continuum of Care funding application. As the Collaborative Applicant the County will submit an application for CoC Planning dollars as part of the FY2016 HUD CoC Competition.

The dollar amount available for CoC Planning dollars will be detailed in the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) once it is released. We anticipate that the amount will be up to 3% of our Continuum's Annual Renewal Demand as allowed by Federal Regulation.

It is anticipated that as in the FY2015 Competition, HUD will not be ranking CoC planning projects in the FY 2016 CoC Program Competition so applying for the full amount available will not affect a CoC's available amount for funding for new and renewal project applications.

II. ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS

As defined by Federal Regulation ([24 CFR 578.3](#)), only the Collaborative Applicant is eligible to apply for CoC Planning Dollars in the FY2016 Continuum of Care competition.

III. APPLICATION PROCESS

Once HUD has released the NOFA for the Continuum of Care (CoC) Program, the County will follow the instructions for completing the Planning Application within E-Snaps. The County will post its draft E-Snaps application to its website for Public Comment in advance of the HUD submission deadline as outlined in the NOFA.

Federal Regulation ([24 CFR 578.39](#)) outline eligible planning costs include the costs of:

- (1) Developing a communitywide or regionwide process involving the coordination of nonprofit homeless providers, victim service providers, faith-based organizations, governments, businesses, advocates, public housing agencies, school districts, social service providers, mental health agencies, hospitals, universities, affordable housing developers, law enforcement, organizations that serve veterans, and homeless and formerly homeless individuals;*
- (2) Determining the geographic area that the Continuum of Care will serve;*
- (3) Developing a Continuum of Care system;*
- (4) Evaluating the outcomes of projects for which funds are awarded in the geographic area, including the Emergency Solutions Grants program;*

(5) Participating in the consolidated plan(s) of the jurisdiction(s) in the geographic area; and
(6) Preparing and submitting an application to HUD on behalf of the entire Continuum of Care membership, including conducting a sheltered and unsheltered point-in-time count and other data collection as required by HUD.

(c) Monitoring costs. The costs of monitoring recipients and subrecipients and enforcing compliance with program requirements are eligible.

IV. SUBMISSION

Submission will be managed via E-Snaps.

The final application for CoC Planning Dollars will be submitted by the Collaborative Applicant along with the Collaborative Application and related Project Applications as outlined by the NOFA.

V. DEADLINE

The deadline will be set forth in the Notice of Funding Availability which has not been released as of the date of this notice.
