Resource Management Plan for Public Lands

WHAT IS IT?

- State requirement from [House Bill 323 \(2015\)](#) and as amended by [House Bill 219 \(2016\)](#)
- Every county is required to adopt a Resource Management Plan (RMP) reviewing 28 resources listed to the right for public lands
- Each county's RMP will be compiled into a statewide RMP

WHY?

- Provides counties with a platform to document local input and management direction on public land resources
- Federal land managers consider local RMPs in the development of federal RMPs
- Adopted RMP will become a component of future Canyon General Plans
