

Midvale Slag Superfund Site Walking Tour

Friday August 12th, 9:00-12:00 pm

Participants *must wear* closed-toe shoes.

Please bring your own water and snacks, and wear sun protection.

Park at the Jordan River Trail Parking Lot off of Jordan River Blvd (7000 South).

Overview: Since 2008, Salt Lake County Watershed Planning & Restoration Program has been working collaboratively with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the Utah Division of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and Midvale City to stabilize the Jordan River Banks along the Superfund Site. The 446-acre Midvale Slag Superfund Site is located 12 miles south of Salt Lake City in the city of Midvale, with a small portion extending into the adjacent city of Murray. The final phase of cleanup is scheduled to be completed up in July 2011 and will include bank stabilization, removal of invasive plants, and revegetation with native grasses, wildflowers, shrubs and trees. The restoration work will help protect water quality while providing valuable habitat for fish, birds and other animals.
